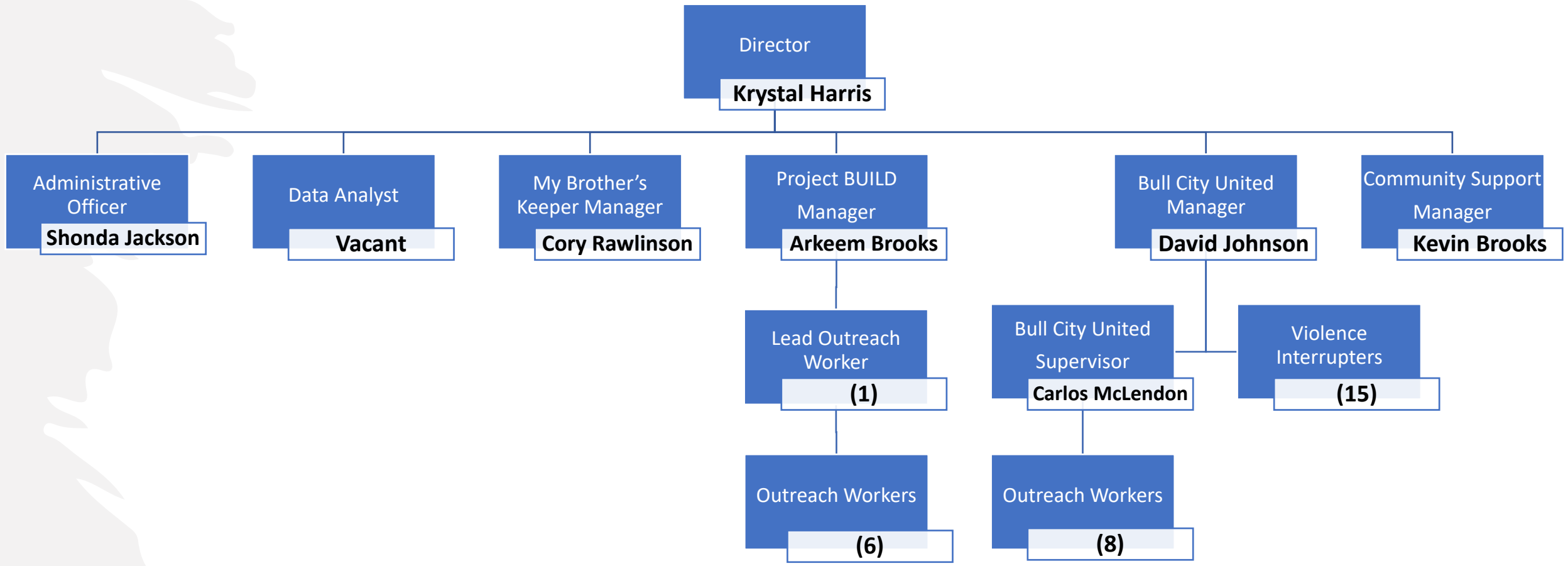

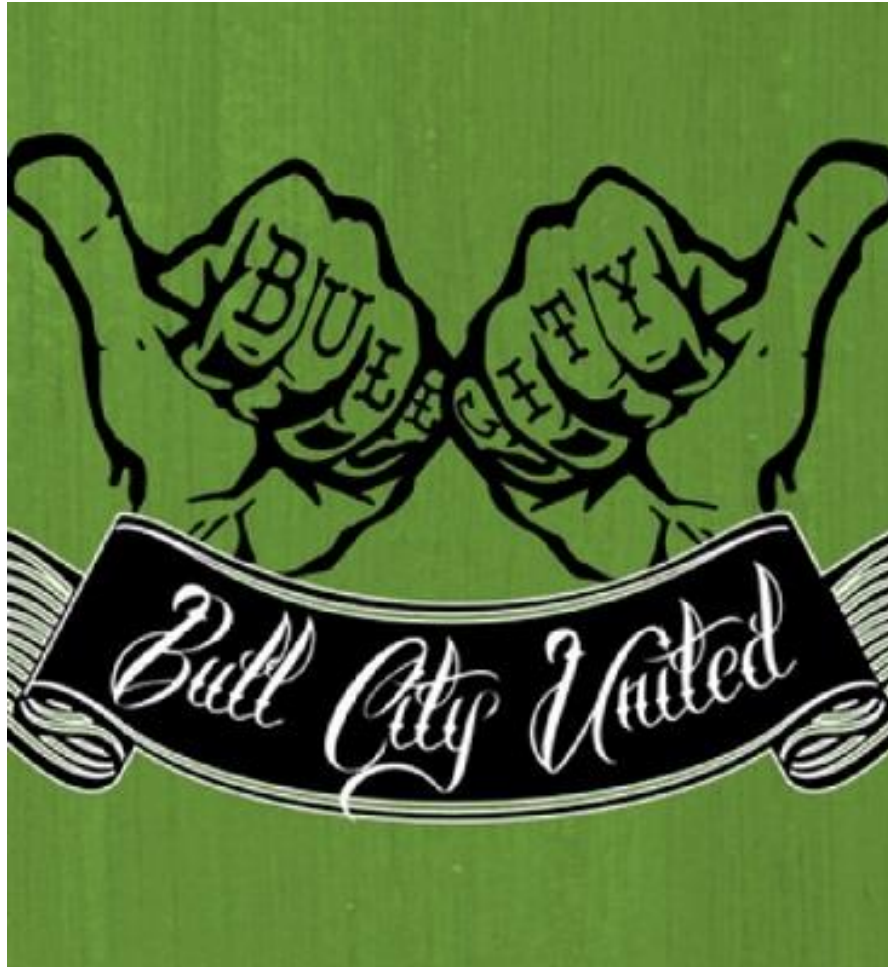

Initially, Durham County used shootings and other gun-related crime data to identify and begin the program in the two census tracts, 13.01 (Fayetteville St) and 14.00 (McDougald Terrace), with the highest incidents of violent crime per 1,000 people.

In 2021, the City of Durham increased their investment and expanded the census tracts to include: 11.00 (Main St), 13.04 (Cornwallis), 17.09 (Oxford Manor), and 23.00 (Southside). The expansion also included: 1 Supervisor, 5 Outreach Workers, and 12 Violence Interrupters.

This brought the staffing total to 25.

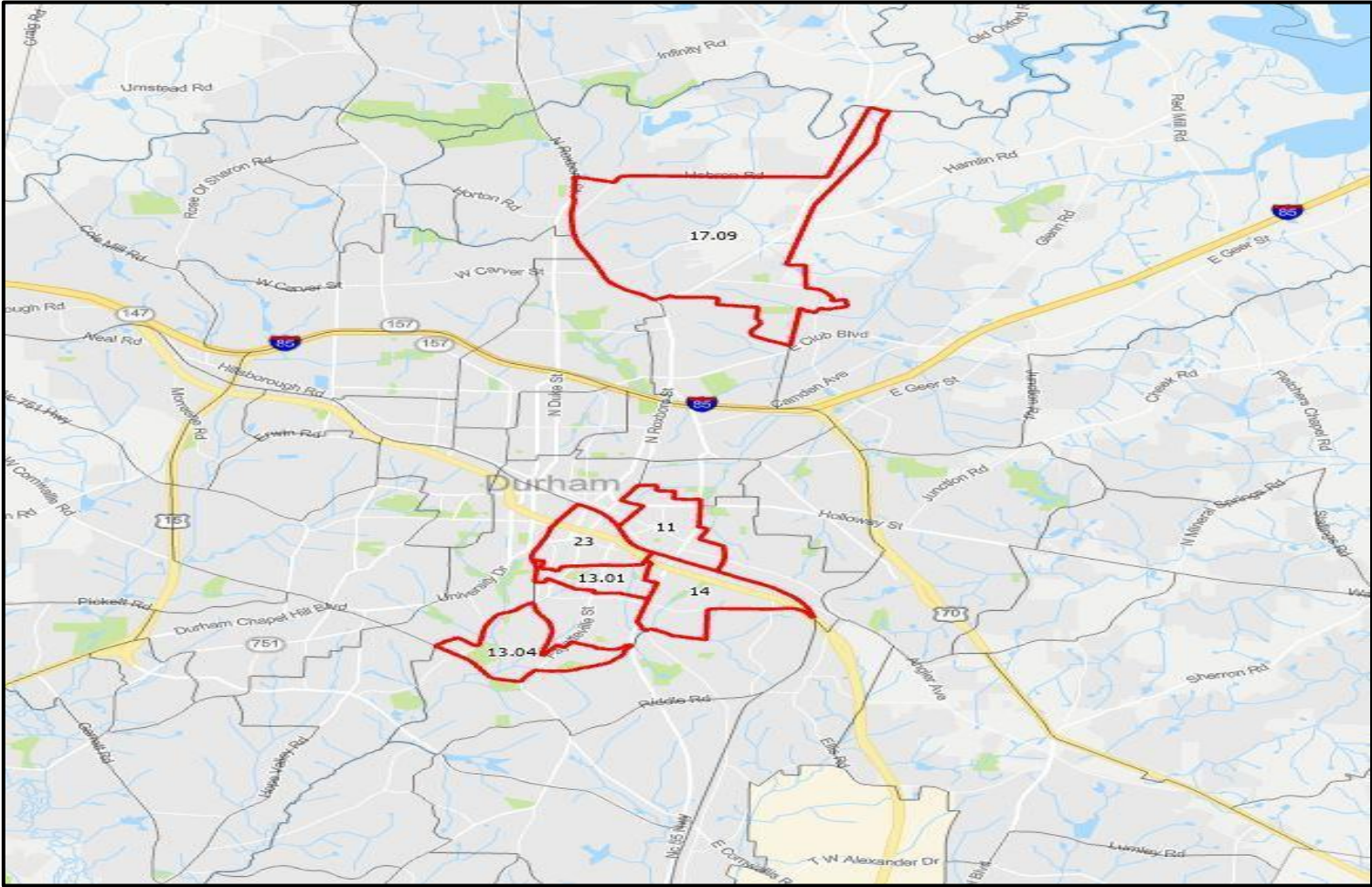

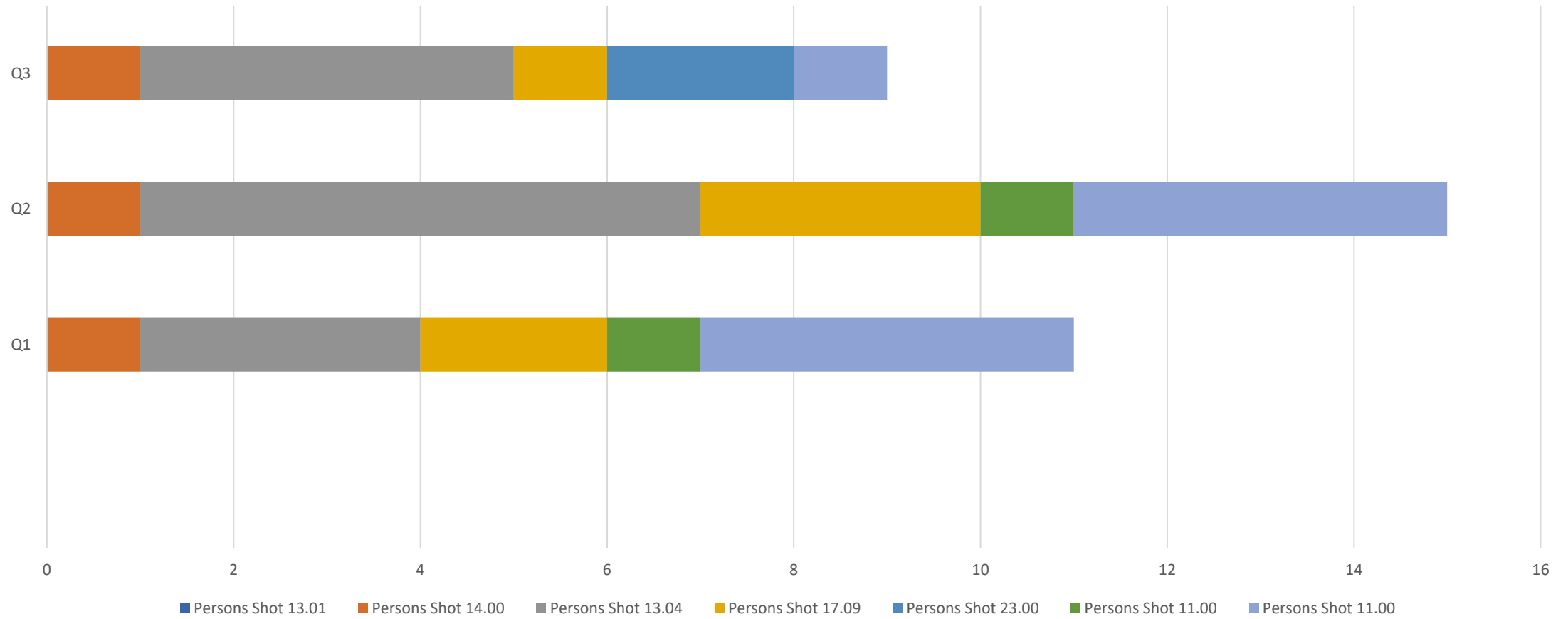

BCU Expanded Census Tract Focus

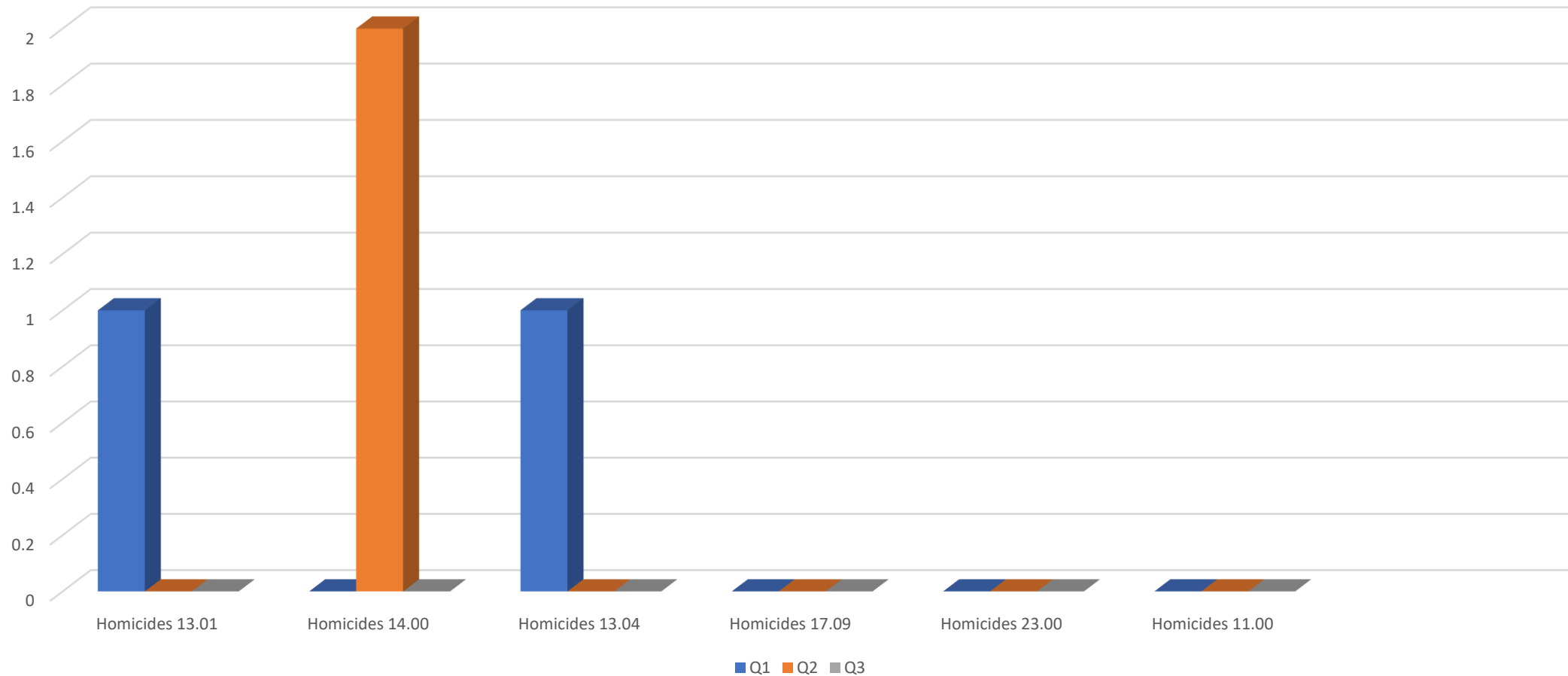


All Census Tracts

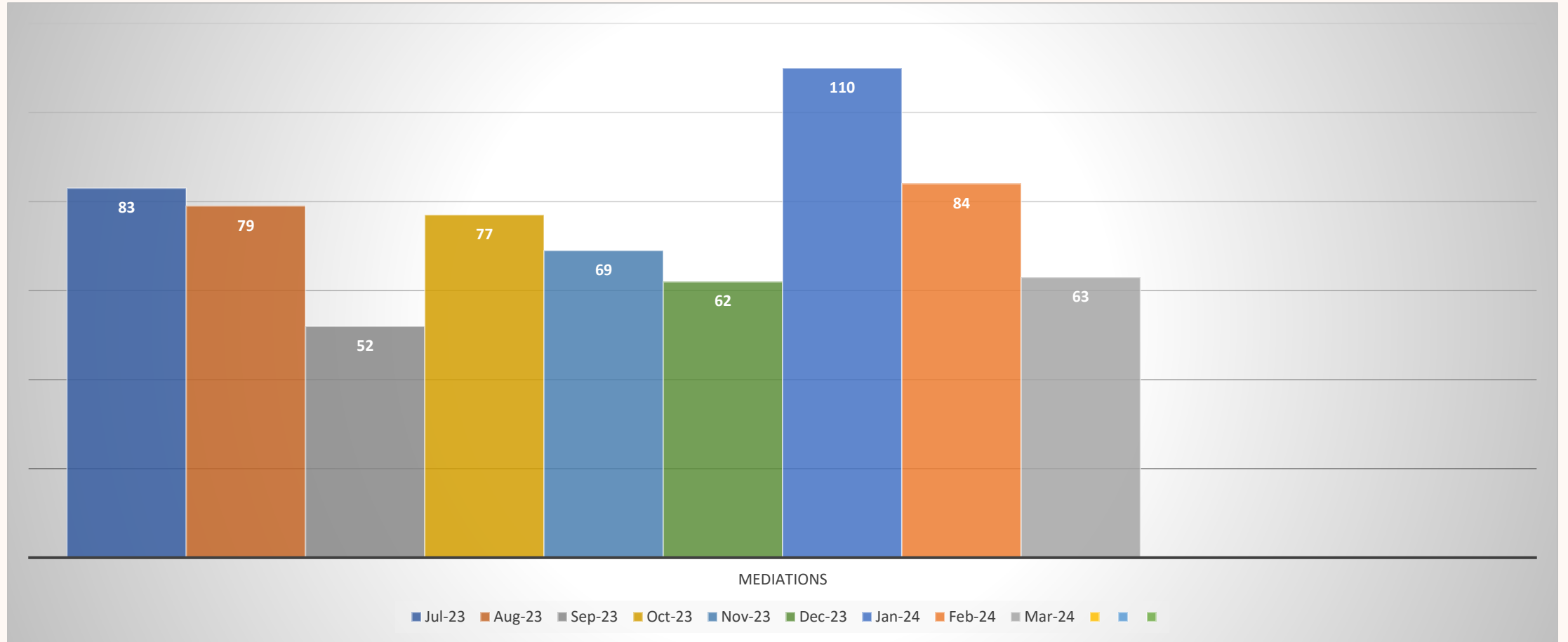
Persons Shot – FY 23-24

What is Project B.U.I.L.D?

- Project BUILD is a gang prevention and intervention program that follows the evidence based Comprehensive Gang Model. Project BUILD provides coordinated case management and intensive services to youth and young adults between the ages of 14 and 21 who are at high risk of gang involvement.
- Project BUILD's street outreach workers work one-on-one with young people to model pro-social behavior, support positive decision-making, connect youth to school and employment, and support involvement in positive activities.

The Intervention Team

TEAM

This team is composed of a multidisciplinary group of professionals from the fields of law enforcement, probation, outreach, education, and social services.

WHAT

The Intervention Team is at the core of the Comprehensive Gang Model.

ROLE

Work together to case manage the intervention targets of the Model and to identify additional prevention, intervention, and suppression activities needed in the target community. The Steering Committee should identify the agencies that are involved in serving or interacting with gang members, and whose staff should serve on the Intervention Team.
