
### About the YRBS

- National (CDC) survey done every two years
  - last conducted in Spring 2023.
- Covers multiple health related topics including physical health, mental health, personal health, school support, and more.
- Durham is an oversampled county.
  - All eligible middle and high schools participated in 2023.



## Demographics


Race and ethnicity for middle and high school students



- 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, and 8<sup>th</sup> graders were equally represented.
- 9<sup>th</sup> graders were over-represented.
- Genders were equal for both middle and high school students.




- Students that experience depression are 5 times more likely to consider suicide.\*

## Physical Activity and Nutrition


- One in five high schoolers reported never eating breakfast in the past week and one in four students reported eating breakfast every day of the week.
- Middle schoolers are 24% more likely to eat breakfast every day than high schoolers.



 High school students are more likely to report they did not exercise at all than they were to report they exercised every days. The opposite is true for middle schoolers.



## **School Support**




- Students feeling like they belong in school is a great indicator of what Adverse Childhood Events (ACEs) trends are occurring.
- Over one in five high school students reported that they agree their teachers give them support and encouragement.



## Substance Use

High School: Alcohol, Marijuana and Prescription pain medicine use in past 30 days




- From 2021 to 2023, alcohol use among high schoolers decreased\*
- High schoolers that reported ever using a vape were 5.2 times as likely to use cigarettes and 7.2 times as likely to use marijuana in the past 30 days. Similar with alcohol use.



## Tobacco Use




- Middle schoolers ever trying a vape decreased from 2021 to 2023.



### Deaths of Despair, Crude Rate (Per 100,000) by Race and Ethnicity 2018-2022



#### Food Security-Related Trends in Durham County, 2017-2022


