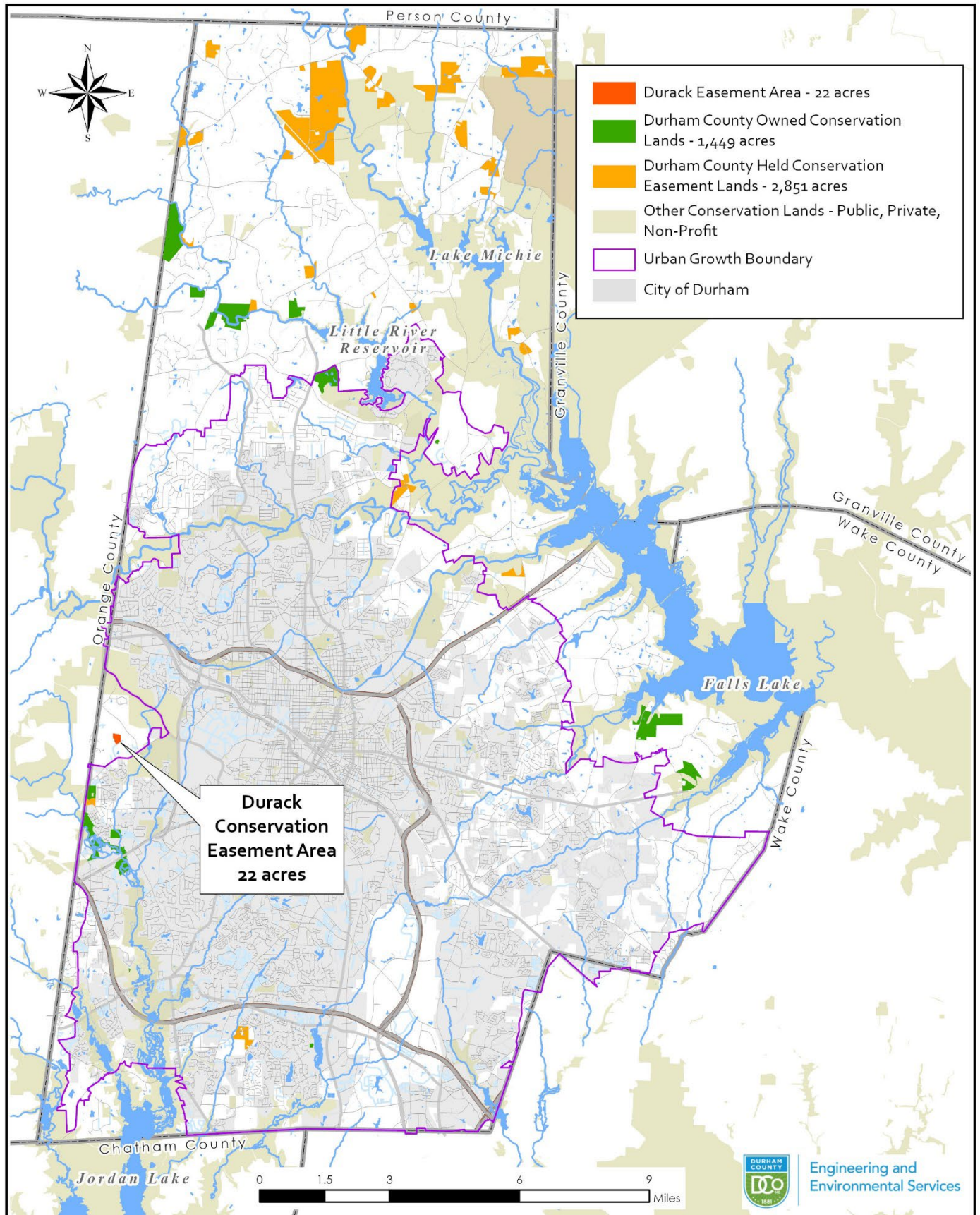
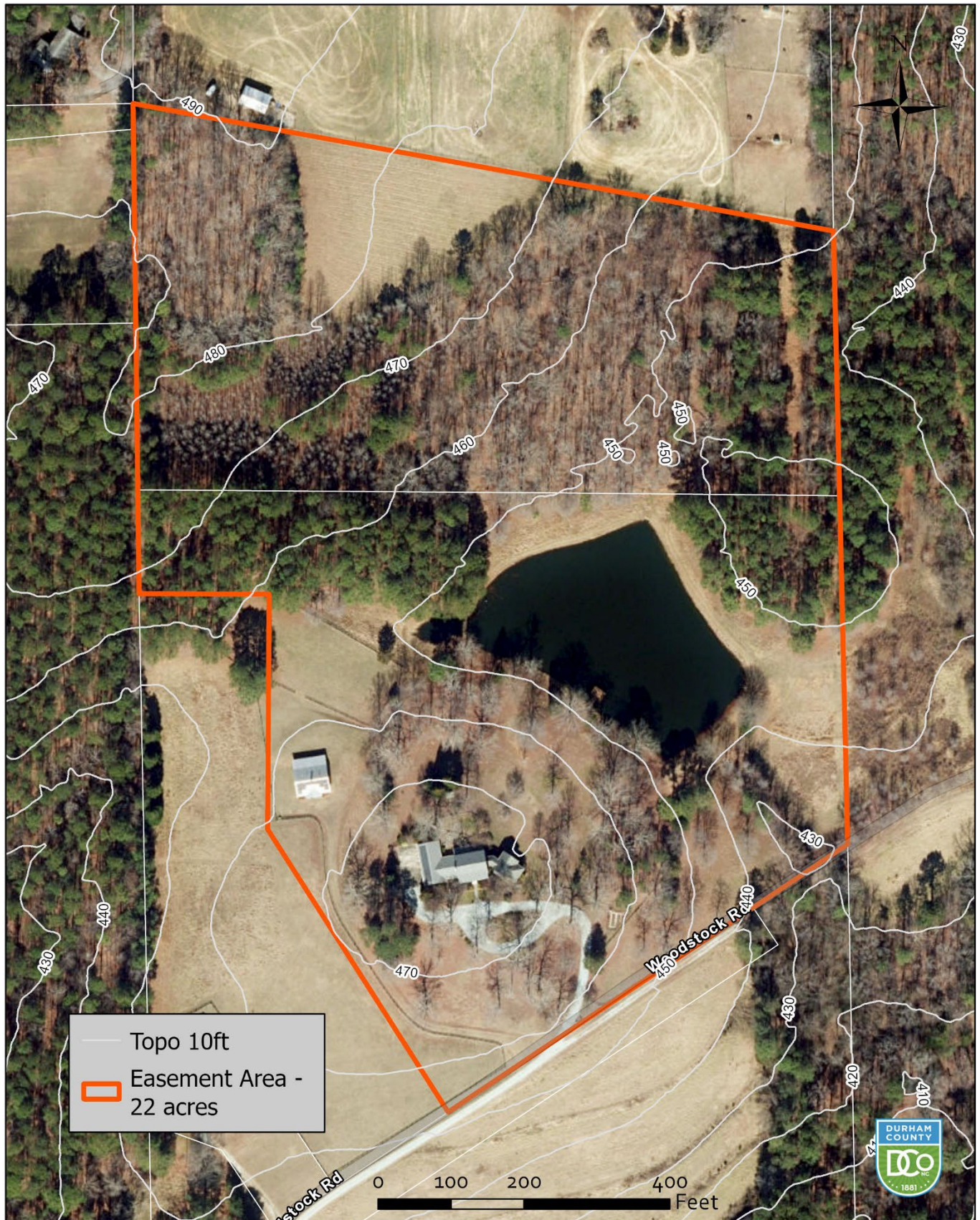


Location - Durack's Oak Haven - Conservation Easement

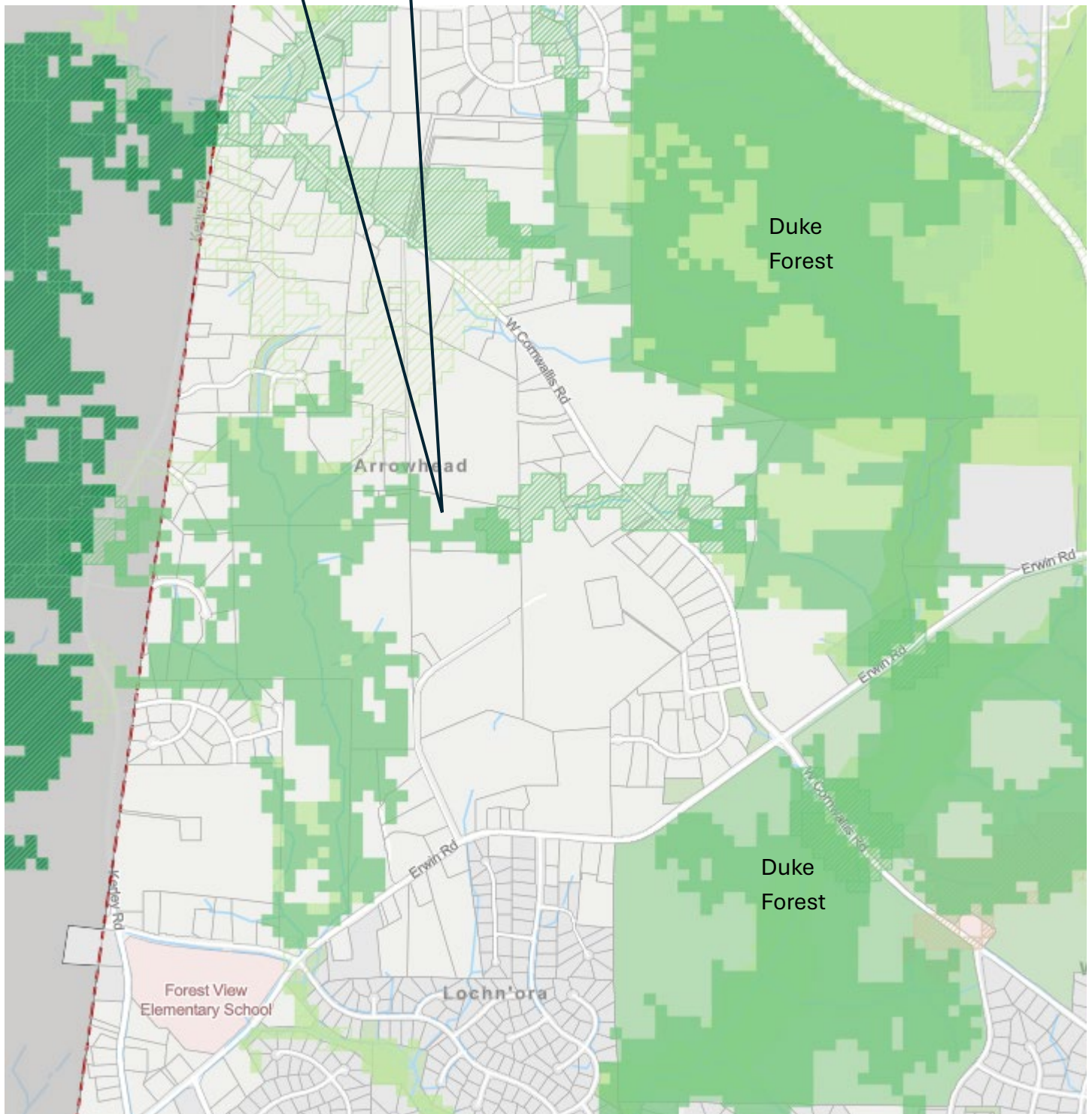


Durack's Oak Haven - 22 acre Conservation Easement

Open meadow areas and park-like spaces with large mature trees provide valuable habitat for pollinators and birds.





Open Space and NC Natural Heritage Program (NC NHP) staff surveyed the site in September and noted a diversity of wildlife habitat. NC NHP notes in their report "*the greatest ecological benefits of the tract are 1) providing native habitat for wildlife – especially possible ephemeral wet habitat for amphibians and flowering plants for pollinators, and 2) protection of large trees.*"
