What is Project BUILD?

- Project BUILD is a gang prevention and intervention program that follows the evidence-based Comprehensive Gang Model. It provides coordinated case management and intensive services to youth and young adults between the ages of 14 and 21 who are at high risk of gang involvement.
- Project BUILD's street outreach workers work one-on-one with young people to model pro-social behavior, support positive decision-making, connect youth to school and employment, and support involvement in positive activities.
- Project BUILD is jointly funded by the City of Durham and Durham County




Current Department Highlights

- At the beginning of FY24-25, Project BUILD moved our service delivery to a Levels Model. There are (4) Levels:
 - Level 1 Assessment/Engagement (3 contacts per week)
 - Level 2 Stabilization (2 contacts per week)
 - Level 3 System of Support (1 contact per week)
 - Level 4 Self-Maintenance (2 contacts per month)

*Goal is to successfully complete program within 18 months



Current Department Highlights





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- Project BUILD received reallocated grant funding of \$11,000 from JCPC. Funds are being used to expand skill building opportunities
- Expanded our vendors to provide pro-social activities for participants
- Enhanced our partnership with Duke Hospital Violence Program (HVIP)
- Started annual graduation recognition for participants
