### **HISTORY**

- 2002 Durham Health Summit highlights access to healthcare (especially specialty care for uninsured patients receiving primary care at Lincoln Community Health Center) as unmet need
- 2003 Task Force formed out of summit to develop solution(s) with physicians and healthcare administrators
- 2006 Community groups (Partnership for a Healthy Durham,

  Durham CAN, Durham Health Partners, and Latino Credit

  Union) met with leadership of Duke University Health System
  to discuss access issues
- 2007 Durham Health Summit gathered input on local healthcare initiatives for the uninsured



### PROGRAM LAUNCH

Duke Private Diagnostic Clinic (now Duke Health Integrated Practice), Durham-Orange County Medical Society, and Durham Academy of Medicine, Dentistry, and Pharmacy agreed to recruit providers to donate specialty medical care

Duke University and Duke Regional Hospitals, NC Specialty Hospital,

Lab Corp, Durham Diagnostic Imaging and Regional Anesthesia agreed to donate services ordered by participating providers

Durham County agreed to fund core operating support for patient enrollment, management of donated care network, and pharmacy support and specialty prescription medications

In 2008 Project Access of Durham County was launched (501-c-3 nonprofit agency)




We connect low-income, uninsured Durham County residents to **donated specialty medical care** provided by physicians and other healthcare practitioners, along with ancillary services and hospital care.

We accept referrals from a primary care provider at **Lincoln Community Health Center** (including its satellite clinics). Patients must meet the following qualifications:

- Have lived in Durham for the past six months
- Have household income below 200% of the Federal Poverty Level
- Be uninsured and not qualify for affordable health insurance coverage

# ACCESSHEALTH NETWORKS




Patients are **enrolled for one year**, unless circumstances change to make ineligible

**Prescription medications** resulting from specialty care consultations may be filled at Lincoln Pharmacy

(utilizing reduced 340-b pricing), or by special arrangement at Duke Pharmacies (donated) or a local pharmacy

**Care managers** assist patients to follow treatment plan, including:

- Make appointment reminder calls
- Coordinate with hospital on discharges
- Assist to obtain medications, supplies (DME orthotics)
- Return to primary care provider/medical home
- Access basic needs (housing, food, rent)
- Access benefits (SSI/SSDI/Medicaid)
- Referrals to community resources
- Interpretation/translation
- Arrange transportation



# DONATED SPECIALTY CARE JULY 2008-JUNE 2023 (15 YEARS)

Patients referred by Lincoln Community Health Center	25,650
Patients enrolled for care (56% of those referred 15% did	14,315
not qualify; 29% unable to reach/did not follow through)	
Patients transitioned to health insurance	16%
Patients needing more than one year of donated care	40%
Specialty episodes of care donated (episode = visits over 3 month period)	43,660
Prescription medications filled	77,440
Value of medications and donated medical care (calculated by Medicare rates FY09-FY15, then by The Duke Endowment FY16-FY23)	\$99.7 million



#### Improved health system utilization

37% reduction in avoidable emergency department utilization and hospitalizations

Less than 10% no show rate at specialty care appointments



#### Improved provider satisfaction

Increase from 14% to 94% of Lincoln providers being successful in making referrals for uninsured

Increase from 43% to 94% of Lincoln providers being satisfied with the care for uninsured





# PATIENT DEMOGRAPHICS









In January 2016, PADC launched HELP – Health Equipment Loan Program (with start up funds from Durham County Department of Public Health's Robert Wood Johnson Foundation award)


HELP collects, repairs, cleans and sanitizes used durable medical equipment and loans it out to Durham County residents who need it, including crutches, walkers, wheelchairs, tub transfer benches, rollators, and more!





Access to Care Committee of the Partnership for a Healthy Durham included creation of medical respite (short term housing) as part of 3 year Community Action Plan in 2013. Launched pilot in 2014 and expanded in 2016 to form **Durham Homeless Care Transitions**.

- Provide funding for short-term housing for persons needing medical stabilization or rest and recovery following hospitalization (at one of several transitional houses)
- Establish or re-establish primary care home
- Establish or reconnect to mental health and/or substance abuse services (via Alliance Behavioral Healthcare)
- Assist with application for disability benefits, or support to return to work
- Develop plan for housing
- Assist to qualify for transportation services
- Identify social and community supports and support reconnection and strengthening relationships



#### CHW INITIATIVE

We collaborate with partner organizations to provide trainings and resources to Community Health Workers (CHWs) and Community Health Promoters (CHPs). CHWs and CHPs serve as necessary bridges between their communities and important healthcare services. Through a combination of outreach, support, and advocacy, they increase health organizations' capacity to deliver high-quality, culturally-informed care and grow their communities' health literacy.

#### **Bull City Strong (June 2022-July 2024)**

Durham County Department of Public Health was funded by the Office of Minority Health to increase health literacy in Durham and increase knowledge about COVID-19. PADC supported training of 9 cohorts of CHPs working to improve health literacy among community members.
