








Site Characteristics



Funding



- In 2023, Durham County was awarded \$18,000 through NC DENR's Community Waste and Reduction Grant to install Swap Shops at the Northern and Redwood Convenience Sites.
- In May 2024, Durham County was awarded \$3.3 million dollars through EPA's Solid Waste Infrastructure for Recycling Grant (SWIFR).

Durham County will renovate and re-design the Redwood Convenience Site in eastern Durham County. The Redwood Convenience Site is a drop-off station serving historically disadvantaged

neighborhoods in the eastern portion of the count yard waste, furniture, white goods, textiles, specia plastics, metals, and glass. The renovation will add improve sustainability measures, and expand the sproject will reduce contamination of recycling strematerials.

Cost Increases

- After a competitive bid process, C.T. Wilson Construction Company, Inc was identified as the lowest responsive and responsible bidder with a bid of \$4,781,705.
- Inflation, tariffs, and Build America, Buy America (BABA)
 requirements have significantly increased the cost of steel,
 concrete, electrical and manufactured components.
 Additional revisions required by NCDOT and City-County
 Planning for site access, stormwater improvements, and
 driveway reconfiguration also increased cost estimates.
- The Redwood Renovation Project requires an additional \$1,688,697 for completion.





Timeline

- January 2026: Approve Construction Contract
- February 2026: Issue Notice to Proceed to General Contractor
- March 2026: Obtain Permits for Construction
- April 2026: Begin Construction (Divert customers to Parkwood And Northern Sites)
- February 2027: Reopen Redwood Site
