Background

- > Joint City, County Schools Housing Initiative
 - > Formed in September 2024
 - > Day Shelter recommendation came out of Pre-Housing Shelter Subcommittee
- >Additional support requested from Downtown Business Community
 - > In Fall and Winter 2024
- >Homeless Services Advisory Committee reviewed recommendation
 - > Winter 2024, requested in the 2025-2026 FY Budget Request



Components of Day Shelter Recommendations

> Joint City, County Schools Housing Initiative Recommendation

- > Design it to test effectiveness of intervention
- > Shelter neighbors from the elements during daytime hours
- > Provide a space for unhoused neighbors to navigate services like mail and getting identification documents
- > Opportunity to partner with other homeless service providers
- > Identify underutilized space for the daytime shelter

>Homeless Services Advisory Committee Recommendation

- > Access to services, mail, laundry, toilets, and showers
- > Many in business community supported the request with this recommendation



Durham County's Day Shelter and Services Center RFP

> Provide Low Barrier daytime shelter

> Provide shelter from 8 AM to 6 PM

> Connection to Activities that promote maintaining dignity

- > Laundry, personal hygiene
- > Receiving and sending mail
- > Access to charging stations, the internet, and other technology
- > Offer case management services

>Connection to services that help promote exits from homelessness

> Examples are workforce development, assistance with accessing benefits, and behavioral health programming



Intent to Award

> Contract of \$350,000 to Urban Ministries of Durham to provide the Day Shelter and Service Center

- > Leverages UMD's existing space to provide for more unsheltered neighbors
- > Includes partnerships with other providers
- > Builds on UMD's established reputation of providing support to those experiencing homelessness

> Services Proposed

- > Access to showers, laundry, mail, computers, charging stations, and the internet
- > Access to UMD's existing Clothing Closet and Food Pantry
- > Connections with case management and resource navigation through UMD and other trusted service providers
- > Mental Health and Substance Use Disorder supports
- > Employment support and workforce development
- > Outreach and Engagement Activities
