On May 11, 2022, the County executed a contract with Andre Johnson Architects to complete a Feasibility study for the Pettigrew Street Renovation project. The request for qualifications (RFQ No.23-026) for the Architectural Design Services for the Renovation of the 826 East Pettigrew Street property was advertised on March 17, 2023, and five (5) responses were received on April 20, 2023. The responses were

reviewed by representatives from Engineering, General Services, and CISS (Community Intervention & Support Services). Two (2) firms were short-listed and interviewed on July 10, 2023. Andre Johnson Architects was selected as the appropriate firm for these projects.

The project includes the development of the programming and conceptual planning of the 826 East Pettigrew Street property. The facility is approximately 13,767 square feet and is a multi-story building with an apparent ground-level plan that is partially exposed to daylight on multiple sides. The facility has offices, meeting rooms, support spaces, and an open gymnasium. It is noted that the design team completed a detailed facility assessment of the existing facility in 2023. During that effort, the design team developed a preliminary program that will be reevaluated during this proposed scope of work. Based on the preliminary program developed, the proposed program is approximately 15,000 gross square feet. The design team will develop programming and planning efforts and provide community engagement and public awareness. Additional scope that will be provided but not included in this scope of services will be branding, marketing, and communication services for programming delivered in the facility. The renovation will consolidate services, improve efficiency, and increase the ability to serve the Community.

For MWBE participation, Andre Johnson Architect, PLLC is an MWBE Certified Black American business and will utilize 70% of the MWBE Certified Black American business and 3.7% MWBE Certified Hispanic American business will be used as MWBE subcontracting participation to perform work on the project. The Detention Center needs to replace its fire alarm system. The current smoke detectors are no longer manufactured and very difficult to procure due to their scarcity. Also, their cost has been driven up due to lack of inventory. The new Facilities Systems Capital Project will phase in the existing smoke detectors, and those smoke detectors that are removed will be kept for replacement purposes on the remaining floors until all are replaced. The Courthouse Elevator Repair Capital project is complete and will not require any additional capital funding.

Funding has been requested for the Facilities Systems project for the replacement of the fire alarm system devices and other electrical and plumbing systems.

Agenda Text: The Board is requested to approve the relocation of all graves within the abandoned cemetery identified as the "Emory Cemetery" under the supervision of the Health Director or the Health Director's designee pursuant to NCGS 65-106.

The Board previously approved the relocation of five (5) particular gravesites within Emory Cemetery (Action Item 23-0854, 12/11/2023). The subsequent discovery of additional graves was not expected, and so this additional request for approval applies the additional seventeen (17) graves located within Emory Cemetery.

The request for Board approval is being made pursuant to NCGS 65-106 by the current property owner JOHN G. UPCHURCH (Deed Book 9967, Page 285-287) to provide for perpetual care, safer access, protection from further vandalism, and interment of all decedents interred in Emory Cemetery in a cemetery more suitable to their memory and proper care. The gravesites are proposed to be disinterred from the current location at 3014 Carpenter Pond Rd, Raleigh, NC 27613 (Durham County) to be reinterred in a perpetual care cemetery pursuant to the direction and supervision of the Health Director or the Health Director's designee.

G.S. 143-129(e) allows local governments to be exempted from competitive bidding requirements in lieu of purchasing furnishings/equipment through group purchasing programs. This provides Durham County with the deepest discount possible for purchases under the respective purchasing programs. Purchases under this request will be made in accordance with the NC Department of Administration (DOA) Statewide Term Contract 420A-Furniture (see 420A attachment).

Many of the new furnishings have extensive lead times due to upholstering and fabrication which requires us to bring these contracts for approval in a timely manner to meet the anticipated occupancy schedule for the project. Interior renovations of S.L. Warren Library are currently underway and are scheduled for substantial completion in August 2024, with anticipated occupancy by staff the following month. This will require all furniture installations to be in place prior to occupancy by staff. The Library and Engineering Departments have collaborated with RND Architects and agree with their recommendation that the County proceed with the procurement of the items referenced in the attached proposals.

Funding for these purchases is available in the SL Warren Library Envelope and Interior Upgrades project account.

The Request for Qualifications (RFQ) for Construction Manager at Risk Services for the Durham County Sheriff's Training Facility was advertised in local newspapers on July 27, 2023. A pre-proposal conference was held on August 8, 2023, and three proposals were received on August 31, 2023. An evaluation committee comprised of representatives from the County Manager's Office, Durham County Sheriff's Office, General Services, and Engineering Department reviewed proposals, interviewed all three firms, and found CT Wilson Construction/Rankin III Grading as the most qualified for the project.

The Pre-Construction Services phase of the project is the first step in the Construction Manager at Risk process in which the contracting team will provide cost estimates, constructability reviews, schedule development and value analysis of the project design. This initial contract is necessary for the CM @ R to provide analysis of the schematic design and design development of the project. Funding for this service will be available in the Durham County Sheriff's Training Facility Capital Project account provided this associated CPA is approved.

This project will entail construction of a new 10,000 square feet training and administrative building, fully renovated outdoor firing range facilities, and site improvements to include improved drainage, walkways, driveways, and parking at the existing Sheriff's Firing Range. The project is scheduled to receive LEED Silver Certification upon completion. The work will be completed in compliance with the North Carolina Existing Building Code and Durham County's construction standards.

On June 7, 2022, the County executed a contract with RND Architects to complete space programming and conceptual design for Project Build at Shoppes of Hope Valley Suite 122. The request for qualifications (RFQ No.24-014) for the Architect Design Services - Renovation - Shoppes of Hope Valley was advertised on October 19, 2023 and two (2) responses were received on November 16, 2023. The responses were reviewed by representatives from Engineering, General Services and the County Manager's Office. The two (2) firms were interviewed on January 5, 2024. RND Architects was selected as the appropriate firm for these projects.

The project includes the development of the design and construction documentation for suite 122 at the Shoppes of Hope Valley located at 3825 South Roxboro Street, Durham, NC 27713. The suite is approximately 5,046 square feet and is a single-story building. The suite was previously a shoe store and currently presents an almost completely open floor plan with storefront on the West facing wall. During the space programming and conceptual design in 2022, the design team developed a preliminary program that will be re-evaluated during this proposed scope of work. From the preliminary program developed, the renovation will include private offices for senior staff, open workstations for supporting staff, a medium sized meeting space, small conference room, and supporting facilities. 24-0163 BULLS Academies Update Presentation from Made in Durham (30min)

Agenda Text: The Board is requested to receive an update presentation on the BULLS Academies from Made in Durham.

The goals of the BULLS Academy - Life Sciences are to align, strengthen and scale the current system that supports Durham residents in obtaining a life science credential and career that provides the higher incomes essential to their ability to create wealth, while scaling a dedicated track that provides Durham young adults with this transformational opportunity.

In January, the Board of County Commissioners approved \$3 million in ARPA funding to support the continuation and scaling of BULLS Biotech stipends and comprehensive support services that are administered in partnership with Durham Technical Community College (DTCC). Funding will also support the creation of a second industry certificate program that will follow the same BULLS model of providing financial and academic support as well as connection to resources.

In early 2020, a collaborative of Durham organizations banded together to form what is now known as the BULLS Academy. The initiative's purpose was to explore ways to scale and connect Durham's Education-to-Career system to the Triangle's high growth-high wage industry sectors. The effort grew in response to concern that area talent demand was outpacing workforce development supply systems in the region, especially in specific growth industry sectors.

The BULLS collaborative engaged key institutions in the community that played a role in the current Education-to-Career system in a series of discussions to identify the most effective solutions. The goal was to learn how to scale best practices while also addressing the system's existing inequities, specifically for Durham's opportunity youth and young adults of color. The result was a BULLS System Scale Plan that identified the process for creating Academies within existing Durham Tech's industry certification programs designed specifically for these population groups by addressing those inequities in the design. Employing this process, the BULLS collaborative identified Biopharma Manufacturing as the most appropriate first industry sector to scale and create the BULLS Biotech Academy to support.

Today's presentation will provide an update on program accomplishments to date as well as future milestones.
