The **<u>other project we are funding</u>** in Durham are 3 intersection improvements around the DBAP / ballpark and courthouse for pedestrian safety (all considered 1 project): Jackie Robinson at Roxboro, Jackie Robinson at Mangum, and Mangum at Dillard.

Some were not good candidates for various reasons, just as time constraints to be under construction within 12 months of funding, or other funded projects that should take care of the issues, or operationally it wasn't a good solution. Also, we are trying to NOT do too many signals since those could be funded other ways.

Sure, High Impact/Low Cost funds are a new pot of money, sort of replacing the old Small Construction funds, but whatever we pick has to be under construction within 12 months, so we don't have time to get R/W. That rules out a lot of turn lanes and realignments, or anything with utility issues, unless there are other funds for PE and R/W.

We have criteria to screen, but not rank, projects, but anything it open for suggestions really. Our criteria are AADT, accident rate, existing lane width, improvement to Level Of Service, non-highway components, other funds, and County Tier Designation.

Since Wake and Durham have STP-BG funds available to the MPOs, we added County Tier to help focus projects in the other counties, but we certainly have good candidates in Wake and Durham that qualify. It's a fairly easy bar to qualify, but the 12 months and R/W issues will keep a lot of projects out.
