Human Services Complex

Department of Social Services

- Average 483 daily appointments. During the energy assistance program, daily appointments average increase to 1,000/day.
- 111,992 appointments in FY 2017

Public Health and Alliance Behavioral Healthcare

Over 340 appointments/per day. Est. 73,000 appts/year

Veteran Services

2,213 appointments in 2017



Human Services Complex Proposed Security Screening

- Fall 2017, the DSS Board asked that security screening be implemented at the Human Services Complex lobby.
- Staff from the Public Health Department, the Alliance and Veteran Services provided input on proposed security screening.
- Six-month security screening pilot recommended for the Human Services Complex lobby.
- Screening pilot will began April 16, 2018.






Human Services Complex Proposed Security Screening Pilot

- Provide insight on short and long-term strategies for improved security measures in the Human Services Complex and other county building locations.

 October 2018.


Human Services Complex Security Screening Pilot Lobby Floorplan








Human Services Complex Security Screening Pilot 3-D Lobby Floorplan

Human Services Complex Proposed Security Screening

Implementation Steps:

- Public awareness campaign to inform public and Durham County employees.
 - Press Releases, Social Media, Written and Oral Communications with primary HHS Complex customers
- Add five (5) full-time and two (2) part-time security officers. FY 2017-18 cost equals \$83,687.90.
 Funding to occur through budget realignments.
- Install two walk-through metal detectors



Pilot Screening Approach

 All guests and staff entering main entrance including employees will be screened.

 Screening approach similar to the technique used at the Durham County Courthouse

 Employee entrances will continue badge access entry and security officer monitoring.

Span of Control Contract Amendment

 Best Practice: Industry recommended security staffing for supervisor to employee ratio range between 1:5 to 1:12

- Recommending a Span of Control range 1:10 to 1:15
 - Allows for additional oversight, improved communication and operational efficiencies
- Achieved through position realignment. Contract increase \$4,453.33

 - **-** \$23,000.00
