

Agenda Action Form Overview

The Board is requested to authorize the County Manager to enter into a service contract in the amount of \$59,670 with Psychiatric Services and Consultation to provide psychiatric services to individuals in the Durham County Detention Facility. The funding for this contract has been approved in the Criminal Justice Resource Center's FY19 budget.

Background/Justification

In 2014, the Criminal Justice Resource Center assumed the contract for psychiatric services in the Detention Center through a Memorandum of Agreement with Alliance Behavioral Health Care. At that time, Psychiatric Services LLC, and its sole proprietor Dr. Patricia Knaudt, had been providing the service at the Detention Center for several years through a third-party contract.

As the facility's Mental Health Director, per the Jail Medical Plan, the psychiatrist holds the ultimate responsibility for making clinical decisions concerning the care and crisis of mental health clients. The vendor operates a weekly clinic for inmates who are experiencing symptoms from their condition and who have difficulty adjusting to the daily life within the jail and is primarily responsible for writing prescriptions for inmates who have a documented mental health diagnosis and history of psychiatric medication use as they enter the jail. In addition, the psychiatrist makes a clinical determination of whether an inmate with no documented medication history should be placed on medication. Medication administration is then monitored, on paper or in person, every 30 days for compliance and effectiveness.

Dr. Knaudt is actively engaged in efforts to reduce the number of mentally ill persons in our jail and participates in the Stepping Up Initiative. She was instrumental in developing a partnership with Duke Medical Center and bringing a fourth year resident to the jail this fiscal year who will provide four hours of psychiatric support services per week at no cost to Durham County.

Durham County Purchasing Division issued a Request for Qualifications for Professional Psychiatric Services (RFQ 18-033) in May 2018. Psychiatric Services and Consultation, PC was the only respondent.

Policy Impact

The agenda item is consistent with historical Board of County Commissioner support for mental health services in the Durham County Detention Facility and an increased emphasis on reducing the number of inmates with mental health concerns.

Fiscal Impact

This contract has been included in the Criminal Justice Resource Center's budget for Jail Mental Health Services since 2014. The availability of Psychiatric Services in the Durham County Detention Facility is paramount to meeting the mandate that inmates' psychiatric medications must be reviewed every 30 days. Additional psychiatric services and onsite hours may be needed in future years.

Recommendation

The County Manager recommends that the Board of County Commissioners authorize the County Manager to enter into a Service Contract with Psychiatric Services and Consultation for the remainder of Fiscal Year 2018-2019 in the amount of \$59,670.
