

Insights on Planning Success

From our experience

- **1. Understand the culture...** nothing is more important
- **2.** Build a foundation... ROI can be significant
- 3. Listen and learn... this is a two-way process
- **4. Leverage networks and previous efforts...** resources have limits
- 5. Communicate well (and visually)... create understanding
- 6. Get a "foothold"... agreement can be incremental
