The JCPC has studied the risk factors and needs of Juvenile Court involved youth in this county and hereby publishes this Request for Proposals. The JCPC anticipates funds from the NC Department of Public Safety (DPS) in the amount stated below to fund the program types specified. Such programs will serve delinquent and at-risk youth for the State Fiscal Year 2020-2021 beginning on, or after, July 1, 2020. The use of the funds in Durham County requires a local match in the amount specified.

For fiscal year 2020-2021, programs submitting proposals should consider the new "Raise the Age Law" effective 12/01/2019 that increased the age of juvenile jurisdiction to include 16 and 17 year old youth.

**Please note:** Due to "Raise the Age" the Durham County Juvenile Crime Prevention Council (JCPC) has been allocated <u>additional funding</u> for the upcoming fiscal year and is seeking <u>additional programs</u> to provide services to justice involved youth.

The JCPC will consider proposals for the following program types. Programs should be outcome-based, should be compatible with best-practice research, and should have the ability to identify, detect and address gang participation

Vocational Skill BuildingRestitution/Community ServiceEmergency ShelterGang InterventionTeen CourtCourt DiversionTruancy prevention/interventionSubstance Abuse Treatment/EducationMentoring ServicesMediation/Conflict ResolutionTutoring/Academic assistanceFamily Counseling

Proposed program services should target the following concerns as reported in the <u>Risk Factors and Needs Assessment</u> for the 139 youth who were referred to juvenile court between July 1, 2018 and June 30, 2019.

- 82% of youth at intake had mental health needs
- 61% of youth at intake were reported to have serious school behavioral problems
- 56% of youth at intake come from families with marginal supervision
- 54% of youth at intake had need for substance abuse assessment and/or treatment
- 27% of youth at intake were reported to be gang members or associates
- 27% of youth at intake had history of victimization

- -Local public agencies, 501(c) (3) non-profit corporations and local housing authorities will be considered for funding. New applicants are required to attend an information session held at 326 East Main Street (date)
- -Please note, while a 30% match is required, that matches provided can be inclusive of in-kind contribution
- -All funded programs will be required to attend regular JCPC meetings/events and sponsored trainings.
