Durham County Government has been recognized as a national leader by another Top 10 finish in the annual Digital Counties Survey conducted by the Center for Digital Government (CDG) and the National Association of Counties (NACo) (10min)

Request for Board Action:

The Board is requested to recognize a recent award received by Durham County's Information Services and Technology department.

Durham County Government continued its excellent recent run in the national Digital Counties Survey by tying for second place among counties with a population of 250,000-499,999. The congratulatory announcement was made by the Center for Digital Government (CDG) and the National Association of Counties (NACo) came on Thursday, July 11, 2019. This win marks an improvement of three places from a year ago and is the fourth time in five years Durham County has been in the top 10. The survey, now in its 17th year, is conducted by the CDG in partnership with NACo to identify the best technology practices among U.S. counties, including initiatives that streamline delivery of government services, encourage open data, collaboration and shared services, enhance cybersecurity and contribute to disaster and recovery efforts.
